

This term....

In our topic, 'Blue Planet' your child will learn the continents and oceans of the Earth along with the equator, and northern and southern hemispheres, and rivers. Our science topic is Plants particularly each part of the plant its function, leading to seed formation and seed dispersal. Next half term, we look at our topic Animals including Humans, where we will look at the skeleton and its roles as well as how to keep ourselves healthy through diet. In computing we dive into the world of animation and create our own stop-frame videos, whereas in art we focus on printing. Creating our own version of 'The Wave'.

PE will take place on Wednesday and Friday afternoons, and we ask that children bring in their PE clothes to change into during the day. Their PE kits should include: their team-coloured T-shirt, black tracksuit trousers or shorts, and trainers. Home Learning Ideas

- Check the labelling on different drinks which is the healthiest and why?
- Research an ocean and the creatures that live there. Create a PowerPoint about what you found.
- Grow some vegetables.
- Create an underwater animal model using recycled plastic materials.
- Make a model that shows the journey of a river.
- Create a code on scratch that links to our topic of plants (for example, could you make an insect move towards a plant?).
